Minutes:

1. Welcome to all attendees (Chair - Pauline)

The Chair opened the meeting and thanked everyone for attending.

- 2. Chairman's report (Chair Pauline)

Cross Country

RSE marshalled the AAA cross country in Cirencester Park last November (and will do again this year)

Beginners Course

We ran another beginners course this year - usually every 2-3 years but the demand was there for another course this year, after the success of last year's beginners programme. We have now welcomed the 'graduated' beginners into the Club and hope they will enjoy their running going forward

'Fun' runs

We have organised a variety of fun runs / social runs including: Halloween run; Bank holiday away days; Sports day; 'Naked' park run – no tech; Head torch runs; Beginners graduation parkrun

Member Welfare



We introduced the 'sash of shame' – for runners who forget their hi-viz in the dark evenings. The safety of club members is a priority for us and during dark evenings we want to ensure that everyone can be seen.

• Club Attendance

Dave reports on club attendance at each committee meeting. On Mondays we had a high of 52 attendees in November and an average of 39. On Wednesdays we had a high of 38 in September and an average of 31.5.

• Keeping Members Informed

We invited members to a committee meeting and a coaches meeting during the year, so that they could see and hear what happens in these forums.

Socials

We ran several socials in the first half of the year – quiz, bike maintenance, karaoke. Our Chair attended the AAA awards for 2024 to witness several members getting wins and places. Our own club championship Awards evening was held in January. The venue of the Gateway Centre was popular and we will look into using it again in future.

Coaching

We welcomed Jo Wood, Phil Scoble and Paul Robertson to the coaching team. Head Coach Dave produced a coaches handbook – excellent document detailing the role of an RSE coach including lots of useful information for the coaches. We also moved stretching to Sheep street car park – deemed a safer and quieter place.

Health and Safety

We made necessary updates to our club documentation around health and safety and in line with England Athletics – managed by Caroline Terry and Sarah Reynolds

Fairford 10K

We ran another successful Fairford event this year. Several runners feeding back that it's one of the best or even the best race they've done. We pride ourselves in putting a lot of effort into the organisation to ensure it is a success. A big thank you to Kevin Joynes-Creed for taking on the role of race director.

Regular Club Sessions

We continued to run our regular Monday and Wednesday evening sessions every week. We currently have 140 members and everyone has access to these sessions.

The Chair explained that the Committee really does work as a team supporting each other. She ran through a brief explanation of what the individual roles cover.

I took over the position of treasurer after the AGM in 2024 and Martin Sherriff handed over the role in July 2024. There has been a lot to learn but I have been well supported by my fellow committee members especially Tracy Pitts and Pauline Tilbury.

It is the responsibility of the treasurer at the AGM to give club members an overview of our accounts and main expenditure. RSE has 3 community accounts: the main account, a charity account and the Fairford 10k race account.

The accounts were submitted to an independent accountant for verification in May 2025 as laid down by our constitution and we have had email confirmation that the accounts have been checked and verified as accurate complying with applicable accounting standards and regulations.

- 7. Members items (All) note: items must have been notified 7 days ahead of the AGM
 - a. **Tail runners:** Rachel Weaver contacted us about the possibility of providing tail runners on Monday nights, especially now that the new beginners have just joined and also because some of last year's beginners are worried about being left behind. This is an excellent suggestion and one that will be actioned asap.

Action 1: Committee to ask for volunteer tail runners and then set up a rota to ensure every Monday is covered.

Action 2: Make sure everyone knows that all routes are available on the website

- 8. AOB or items to take to the Committee (All)
 - a. RSE social committee: we have had no nominees for the role of social secretary this year but socials are an important part of RSE. Therefore the Committee will discuss the possibility of setting up a social 'committee' where a small group of volunteers might be willing to organise a few socials during the year, with the full support of the Committee. It has been suggested that we hold some alcohol free socials. We are always open to suggestions.
 - b. Communication of changes (Linda Edwards): Linda asked that changes to the Committee are communicated to members quickly so as to avoid any rumours spreading



- c. Overseas club trip (Linda Edwards): Linda asked if we have considered offering a club trip abroad where members could all go to one location and decide whether to run 5K, 10K, half marathon, marathon. This will be taken to the Committee to be discussed.
- d. New starter information (Rachel Bodey): Rachel asked what information goes out to new starters? There is a new members guide/welcome pack that is emailed to every new starter which explains how sessions work, how to sign up, explains the club championship etc
- e. Cross country (Jon Campbell): Jon has asked for the Committee to support the promotion of the Gloucestershire Cross Country this year. He is willing to coordinate and organise some teams and believes it would be great for the Club to be better represented. The Committee will discuss how this could be done at the next Committee meeting.
- f. Wednesday morning efforts (Pauline Tilbury): Pauline announced that the Wednesday morning efforts sessions run by Carol Sworn have been very successful and will become official Club sessions from next week. Thank you to Carol for setting these up.
- g. Introduction of 'run assistants' (Pauline Tilbury): In order to satisfy coach to runner ratio requirements for insurance, we will be approaching a number of members to ask if they are willing to become 'run assistants' someone responsible who can refer any issues to the on duty coach. This is because we often have high numbers in sessions and want to ensure we are compliant with insurance.
- h. Fairford Race Director for 2026 (Pauline Tilbury): Kevin Joynes-Creed is stepping down as Race Director after 2 years in the role and running very successful races and Sarah Reynolds has agreed to take over the role in 2026.
